The Peralta Community College District Board of Trustees takes up a light agenda tonight at 7 in the boardroom at [333 E. Eighth St.](#)

Among items of interest: consideration of revised Board Policies 6740 and 6741, updates designed, respectively, to clarify the role of the Citizens' Oversight Committee, and to ensure proper expenditure of parcel-tax revenues.

Trustees will also weigh approving \$550K in legal fees to a host of outside firms, and another \$47K for travel agency costs related to study-abroad programs.

Making its regular agenda appearance: the board's apparently unending evaluation of the chancellor.

And conspicuously absent: anything about plans to get the district's derailed ONEPeralta project back on track.
