The Peralta Community College District Board of Trustees kicks off the 2016-17 school year tonight at seven in the boardroom at 333 E. Eighth St.

In addition to entertaining a resolution in support of Proposition 55—the November ballot initiative that would extend 2012’s Prop 30, the public-education lifeline—trustees will hear a budget presentation from VC Ron Little. Little will argue for adopting the final 2016-17 PCCD budget, which the district only made available for public review on Friday.

The board will mull eight different management appointments, seven of them interim, continuing a spree of recent hires that has dramatically increased the size of the Peralta administration. Also on the table: the colleges’ follow-up reports to the ACCJC, the accrediting body whose verdict Peralta awaits in January.

Further, trustees will consider paying \$45K to Clague Executive, Leadership and Technology, a consultant, to evaluate the work of Ferrilli, another consultant. Ferrilli won more than half a million dollars’ worth of district contracts last year.

In other news:
